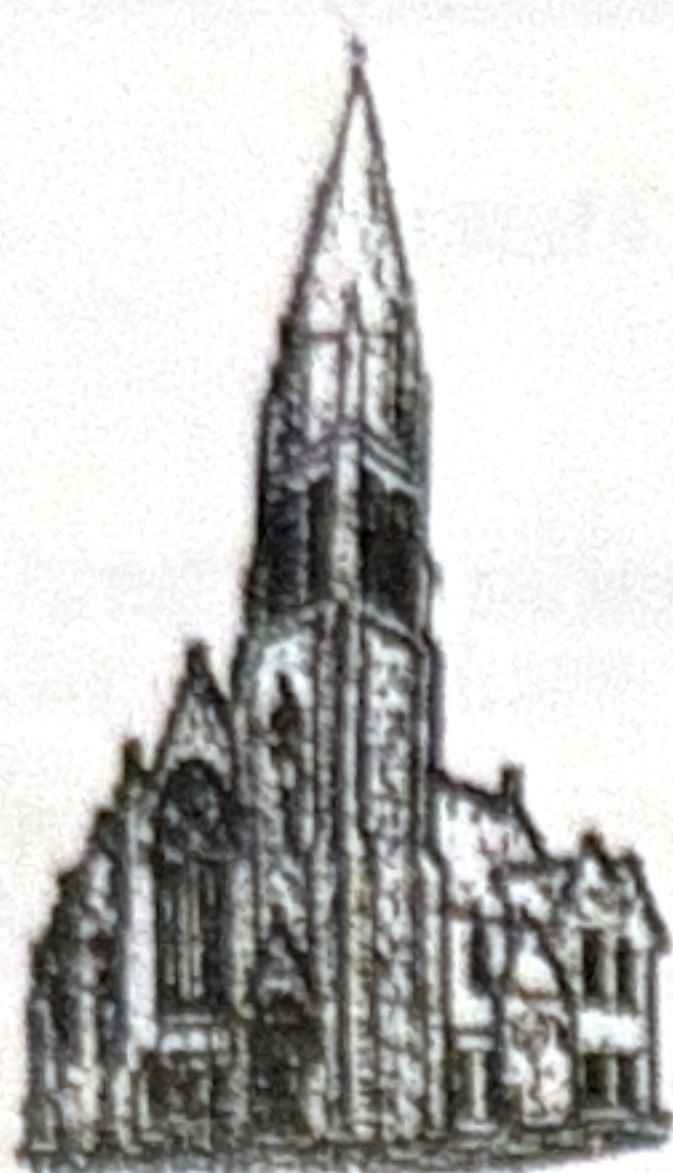

Last year, the Presbytery decided to close and sell our church. We appealed. The Appeals Committee of the Commission of Assembly upheld our appeal and gave the Kirk Session the task of working with the Presbytery to produce a new section of the Presbytery Plan based on a Mission Plan for the Congregation which will address the future of buildings.
